## The Partnership Bids Farewell to our 2023 Equity Policy Research Fellows



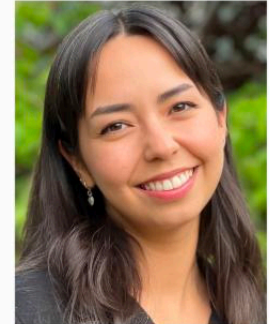
